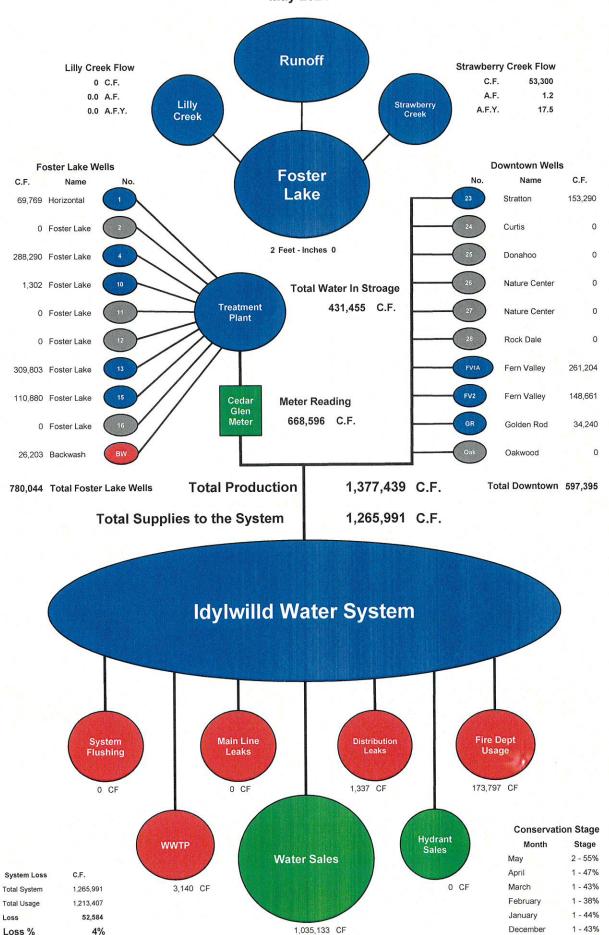

## Water System Schematic For Operations Report May 2021



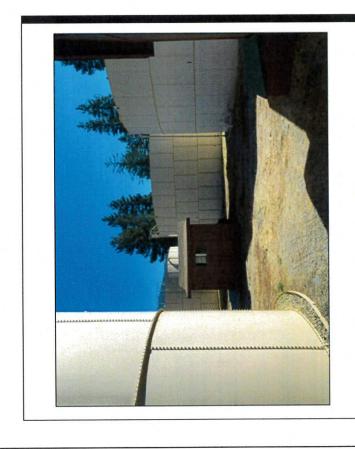

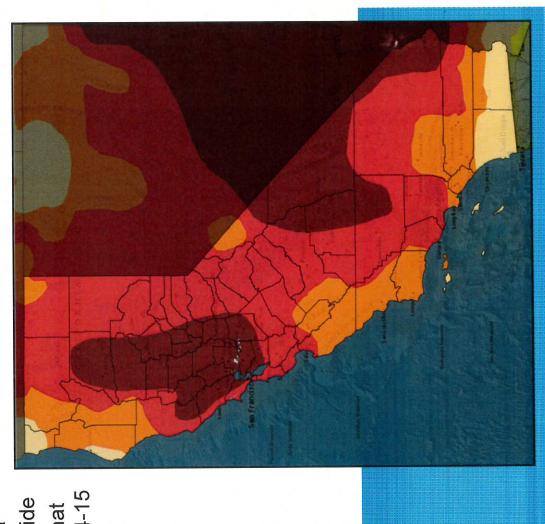

# State Water Resources Control Board

- Ongoing dry conditions in California
- Prepare for drought impacts statewide
- On some streams, runoff is lower that during the critically dry year of 2014-15

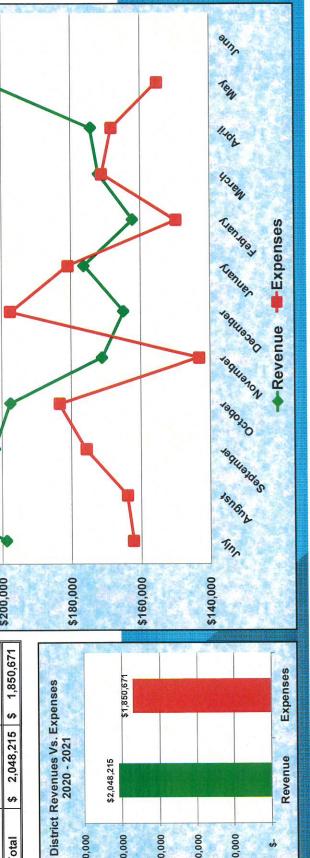

## Recommendation:

Board of Directors will consider appointing a qualified candidate to the Board of Directors to fill the vacancy seat. If necessary the Board will interview the applicants prior to the appointment.

## Background:

Just minutes prior to the May 19, 2021 Board of Directors meeting, Dave Hunt gave his written resignation from the Board.

At the end of the May 19, 2021 Board of Directors meeting, President Schelly requested, with concurrence of the Board, staff to advertise the available Board seat.

Thus far, two members of the community, Rachel Teeguarden and Steve Olsen, have provided letters of interest to fill the vacant Board Seat.

The Board has 60 days from the date of a Director's resignation to appoint a candidate to fill the vacant seat on the Board. Should the Board not fill the seat within the 60 days, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors has the right to appoint a candidate of their choosing from the Idyllwild community to fill the vacant seat.

## Conclusion:

General Manager recommends filling the vacant seat prior to the conclusion of the 60 day limit.
